Lisa Humphrey, MD is Director of the Division of Hospice and Palliative Medicine at Nationwide Children's Hospital. Lisa has an undergraduate degree in child psychology from Columbia University and attained her medical degree at Case Western Reserve University's School of Medicine. She then completed her pediatric residency, chief residency, and palliative and hospice medicine fellowship at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia.

Dr. Humphrey oversees a large palliative and hospice program that provides inpatient consultative care, clinic-based care, and home-based hospice and palliative care services. This program services over 800 consults per year. It boasts a robust complement of symptom management and decisional, emotional and spiritual support.

Dr. Humphrey is also the Program Director of the Nationwide Children's Hospital fellowship in Hospice and Palliative Medicine. Additionally, she supports the education of multiple adult trainees and two med/peds fellows per year and oversees and supports the pediatric hospice and palliative medicine educational curriculum for medical students and pediatric residents. She is also actively involved in the Academy of Hospice and Palliative Medicine workgroups seeking to define pediatric palliative care and hospice educational objectives for adult practitioners.

Dr. Humphrey's academic interests reside in metric and programmatic development and has written and presented on QI topics such as safety in hospice and palliative medicine. She also is an executive member of the Pediatric Palliative Care Improvement Network, a grassroots organization seeking to define and implement QI initiatives in pediatric hospice and palliative medicine.

Finally, Dr. Humphrey works with both regional and national palliative care committees. She is an elected member of the American Academy of Pediatrics Executive Committee for its Section of Hospice and Palliative Medicine. Additionally, she is the chair of the Ohio Pediatric Palliative Care End of Life Network.
